PROFILE OF F. A. AHMED COLLEGE, GAROIMARI

The year 1984 of the last century was an eventful year and epoch in the history of Garoimari and its neighboring areas. At that time, a handful of people got knowledge literacy, the logic of higher education, by and large, disappeared in the area. It was almost beyond the dream of generating higher educated people from a man-power producing industry establishing in Garoimari. A few among all could realize the need of higher education. Among them, we must take the name of the following personalities like Omor Ali Sarkar (the founder president of Managing Committee), AbdulHakim (the founder secretary), many others who endeavored their relentless effort in establishing the college. Abdul Qayyum Al Aman took pioneer responsibility as Honorary Principal of the college when regular classes started. He played an active and pioneering role in shaping and moulding the foundation of the college. Besides, the contributions of all the MLAs of Chhaygaon Constituency since 1980 till date aren't less memorable for their all kind of assistance. Garoimari is mostly dominated by the minority Muslims people dependent basically on agrarian economy, the people of the area extended spontaneous support to establish a college. The mission of the college was to spread the ray of the higher education by breaking the barrier of darkness among the rural people.

In the year 1984 on an auspicious day, the dream turns into reality with the establishment of the higher educational institution named F.A.Ahmed College. The college is named in memory of Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed, an Assamese son who decorated the sovereign chair of India during the period, 1974 to 1977. It is the only higher educational institution that has been imparting education in the Degree Classes (Arts) since its inception.

At the initial stage, Abdur Rahman Khan was the honorary principal of the college. Mr. Habibur Rahman rendered his service as Principal of the college to till his retirement on 31st December 2014. The college was provincialized by the State Government of Assam w.e.f. 01/01/2013 but the Post of the principal was not provincialized. It always will remain in-compensatory to him who offers about 24 year's prolonged service. After his departure, Abdul Awal Sahab has taken the charge of the principal and being continuing.

The college has its vast and sprawling campus covering area 3.34 hectares (25 bighas) of the land and the serene atmosphere of the college attracts one and all. The co-educational Arts Degree College which had a humble beginning with 161 students and 10 faculties at the time of its establishment. At present, about 766 number of students has been enrolled and facilitated for higher education. The teaching component comprises 30 faculties and various supporting services including an 'Internal Quality Assurance Cell' (IQAC). The student feedback system has been introduced to remove the deficiencies of the course and enhancement of teaching quality.

The college has traversed a long distance since its inception. It has produced a large number of brilliant students into university and many of them are well placed in social as well as personal life.

Academic Programme Offered (Under National Education Policy-2020)

The College has been offering courses of Study in Arts in Degree Regular and Honours level under Gauhati University as per CBCS course framework. COURSE STRUCTURE (3-YEAR DEGREE)

The detailed course structure for a 3-Year Bachelor Degree is represented in the figure below. This structure depicts a general scenario where a student will choose one major course and two minor courses. It is to be noted that in order to a re-entry into the 3-Year course in Semester III or V for students who have opted for leaving the course after the 1st and 2nd year respectively, additional vocational course of 4-credit has to be done by the student on exit.

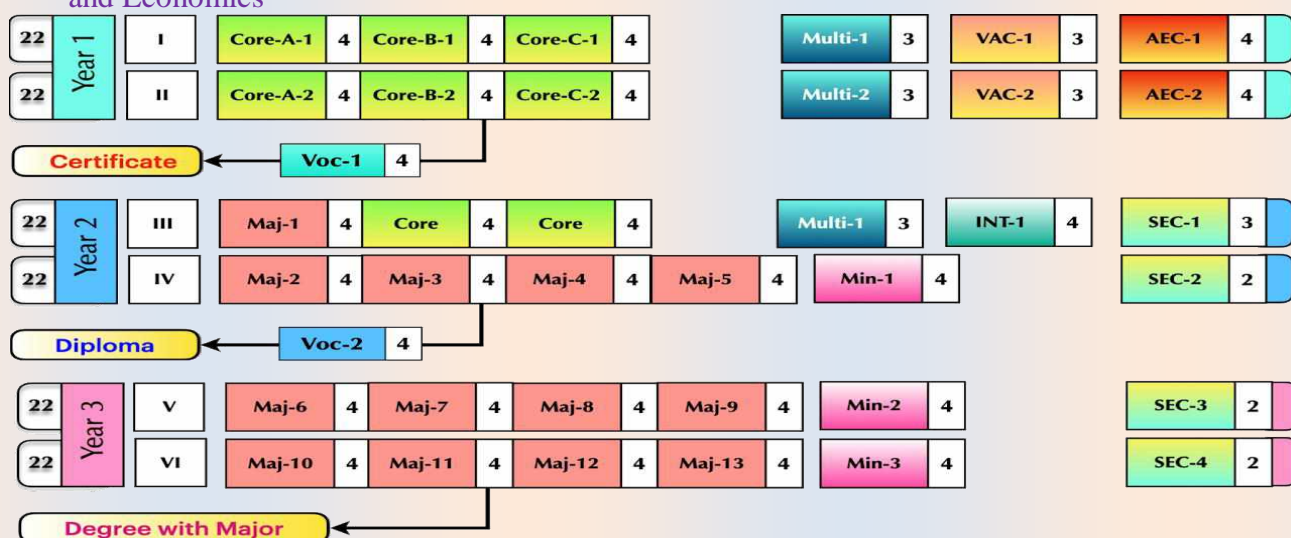

Salient features

- Major in History and Minors in Political Science and Economics. The student declares the Major subject in Semester III.
- The student can however opt for Major in any of the three courses i.e. History, Political Science, and Economics, by the time he/she reaches Semester IV, in case she wants to opt out of History.
- There will be 4 Open Credits for the students in Semester IV, V, and VI, which she can leave out altogether. In this case, he/she will have total credit of 120 for a 3-Year course, which is baseline.
- In case, the student wants to use the Open Credits, he/she can utilize them for obtaining a Double Major by the 4th year. Such an example is given afterwards.

- ❖ The student can however opt for Major in any of the three courses i.e. History, Political Science, and Economics, by the time he/she reaches Semester IV, in case he/she wants to opt out of History.
- ❖ There will be 4 Open Credits for the students in Semester IV, V, and VI, which she can leave out altogether. In this case, he/she will have total credit of 120 for a 3-Year course, which is baseline.
- ❖ This student however utilizes one Open Credit in 5th Semester to do an Elective Paper on Research Methodology, thereby saving time for the same, when she progresses to 4th year.

This option is similar to Example #1, but the student has chosen to take 12 more extra credits in Semesters IV, V, and VI so that he/she has a total of 48 credits on minor subject thus converting the subject to a second major subject. In this case, the second major is in Political Science.

Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

Each semester of a 4-Year Bachelor Degree (FYUGP) course will have a **maximum of 22** credits with a total of 132 credits for 3-Year Degree Course and 176 credits for a 4-Year Degree Course. Apparently, the Masters Course will have 44 credits in a year with a total of 88 credits in two years. The baseline for total credits is 120 for a 3-Year course and 160 for a 4-Year course. So, a student can choose to have a total credit between 120 and 132 by the end of a 3-Year Bachelor Degree course.

The basic division of credits for a 3-Year Bachelor Degree course is shown in figure alongside. The basic division for a 4-Year course is shown in figure. In the 4th year, there are however two options – (a) Degree with Honours and (b) Degree with Honours and Research. Overall, a 3-Year Degree course consists of two sections — a **Core Section** and a **Common Section**. While the Core Section consists of Major and Minor papers, the Common Section is divided into 5 sub-groups.

- **Multi-disciplinary Courses**

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII.

- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

This is a 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication)

- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester III.

- **Value-based Courses (VAC)**

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

- **Internship**

All students are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4.

As shown in the figures, the base credit score for a 3-Year course is 120 and a student needs to have at least 50% of 120 i.e. 60 credits in a subject to qualify for a major in that subject. In the same way a minor course will have 12 credits and a student can have two minors with a total of 24 credits. Apart from the Major subject, if a student can obtain 48 credits in a particular subject, the student will get a double major.

POST GRADUATE COURSES UNDER KKHSOU

Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University Study Centre of F. A. Ahmed College, Garoimari was founded in the year 2007. Initially it was started with Bachellor Preparatory Programme (Now discontinued by university) and Bachellor Degree programme. Gradually the centre started offering Master programmes also. As per guide line of the university the study centre organizes counseling sessions for the learners on Sundays, Self Learning Materials (SLM) are supplied by the university and are distributed by the study centre.

At present, the study Centre is offering the following Courses

- A. Honours & Regular Courses in all subjects (Arts Stream).
- M.A. Courses in all subjects as per availability in the University.

At present, the study center has been imparting education about 350 learners.

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

Eligibility

Degree Course: A candidate must pass Higher Secondary Examination of AHSEC or equivalent (10+2 Standard) examination recognized by UGC.

The admission will be made on the basis of merit and personal interview. The prospectus and application form also can be downloaded from the college website wwe.faac.org.in Provision of reservation for SC/ST/QBC/MOBC candidate, physically handicapped and for candidates having proficiency in extracurricular activities will be made as per the govt. rules and regulations. Complete application form in all respects, must be submitted online on or before the last date of submission. Necessary documents must be uploaded online. The college will not entertain application for admission received after the last date of submission.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- i. Application for Admission to the college should be made in Online Application Forms available on Collegewebsite
- ii. Admission is done strictly on merit basis, and is governed by the Admission rules of the College. The decision of the Admission Committee in this regard is final.
- iii. Applicants will have to appear in person at the time of admission with original copies of Pass Certificate, Mark Sheet, Age Certificate, Character Certificate (from the Heads of the institution last attended), Caste Certificate (where necessary) and any other document notified from time to time.
- iv. No application will be accepted after the last date of submission.
- v. Reservation Of seats will be entertained as per Govt.rules.
- vi. Extra Curricular (EC) quota will be maintained as per Govt. norms in all classes

Fee Structure: The fees structure of different courses will be in adherence to the guidelines of the Government of Assam. These structures will be notified in the college notice board and college website.

CANDIDATE SEEKING ADMISSION SHALL HAVE TO PRODUCE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS IN ORIGINAL AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

- One set photocopies of mark sheets duly attested, of qualifying/last attested examination (H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C.)
- Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended must be enclosed with the application form.
- Four recent passport size photographs should be pasted on the application form and two photographs are also to be enclosed.
- H.S.L.C. Admit Card (attested copy) must be enclosed with the application form.
- ST/SC/OBC candidates, and those seeking admission in co-curricular quota must enclose relevant certificates.
- Applicant having gap period should produce gap certificate.
- Application form must be completed in all respects.
- Applicants are directed to bring all the original certificates and testimonials for verification at the time of submission of forms and interview.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE-GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Students must come to the college invariably in prescribed uniform. They must bring Identity Card and Student's Handbook and produce the same when asked for. This rule is considered as minimum in maintaining discipline of the college.
2. All the students should read the Notice Board of the College regularly and note own important instructions in the Student's Handbook.
3. Students should be decent, courteous and polite at all times whether they are in the class or in the college premises.
4. Students should respect the beauty and cleanliness of the college and take utmost care to promote the same.
5. Scribbling on books, desks and walls is strictly prohibited and liable to fines.
6. Spitting, writing and sticking anything on the college walls/rooms are strictly prohibited.
7. Students should park their vehicles in the area allotted for the purpose,
8. Disobedience and misbehavior towards staff members or repeated breaking of college rules or behavior objectionable to the good tone of the school, even outside the college premises will deserve severe punishment or even dismissal if warnings are ignored.
9. Students are prohibited to go out of college premises during college hours without the permission of the principal. They are advised to utilize their leisure time in the college library/ common room/ canteen. They will not be allowed to loiter or sit in the veranda.
10. Ragging in any form, inside or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited by law. Any student found indulging in ragging will be rusticated from the college.
11. The college is a No smoking/ No Tobacco/ No Drugs/ No Alcohol Zone. Students found violating these rules will be dealt with as per rules of the college.
12. Students should not damage the property of the institution. Cost of any damage will be recovered from the students as compensation.
13. Students will not include in any anti-social activities or activities causing hindrance to the academic and administrative functioning of the college. Those found indulging in such activities will face disciplinary action to the extent of expulsion from the college.
14. During the teaching hours all areas around the classrooms will be observed as Silent zones. The authority will deal with students who create any disturbance, as it deem right. Keep silence when the classes are on.
15. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited during class and examination hours. Any violation is subject to severe disciplinary action.

16. No student shall intentionally or recklessly disrupt or impede or attempt to disrupt or impede the activities and functions of the college, or any part thereof.
17. Irregular attendance, constant negligence of assignments will be severely dealt with. A minimum attendance of 75% is essential for appearing in the university examinations. In case of absence due to unavoidable circumstances, prior permission from the appropriate authority has to be taken and endorsed the same handbook, In case of sickness; students will have to produce a Medical Certificate with application from guardian.
18. Class-tests, Unit-tests, Assignments and Terminal/Sessional examinations are obligatory on all students. No one should absent himself/herself for an examination/test. If a student is absent for a test or examination a re-test or re-examination will not be given except on medical / genuine grounds.
19. No candidate shall make use of any unfair means in any examination.
20. Students' participation and active co-operation in all observation days and other co-curricular activities is must.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

For the admission in B.A. 1st Semester (Major/ Minor), the reservation policy of State Govt. Assam is followed.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Quality is of vital importance in every area and particularly in the field of higher education and the growing consciousness regarding the enhancement of quality in higher education through the globe profusely speaks of it. Keeping in mind the new challenges of higher education, the college has constituted an "INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL" to look into the qualitative aspects of the College. It is a high level committee that sets down quality parameters and ensures their implementation.

RESERVATION RULES

1. There is a provision for reservation of seats, as per Government of Assam rules for the candidates belonging to the State of Assam. In this respect, caste certificate issued by the competent authority under Government of Assam only shall be valid.
2. A maximum 5% of the total seats may be earmarked for students having outstanding performance in Extra-Curricular Activities (Sports/Cultural/NCC/ Scouts & Guides etc.).
3. There is a provision of reservation of 3% of the total seats for 'Differently abled' candidates under PWD category.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Use of Mobile Phones by students in the College premises is restricted. Violation of this rule will invite severe disciplinary action.**
2. The College lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. Students are always expected to maintain a high standard of discipline.
3. Every student must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the hostels. A declaration to that effect will have to be signed by a student at the time of admission.
4. A student found guilty of misconduct or violating college rules shall be subject to disciplinary action. Disciplinary action includes expulsion from college, suspension for a period, debarring from appearing in examination, compulsory transfer etc.
5. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the college and hostel campus. Students found indulging in act of ragging shall be strongly dealt with as per the directives of Supreme Court of India.
6. Smoking, chewing of tobacco and use of any intoxicants in the college and hostel campus is strictly prohibited.
7. Loitering in the College campus or verandah is prohibited. A student may be reprimanded if found doing so.
8. Cleanliness is a collective responsibility of each and every member of the College. Spitting on walls is strictly prohibited. Writing slogans or sticking of bills on the walls is also strictly prohibited.
9. Students should go through the College Notice Board regularly for all information.
10. All powers of maintenance of discipline and observance of college rules and regulations rest with the Principal of the College and his/her decision shall be final in all such matters.

F. A. Ahmed College has a uniform dress code for both boys and girls.



DISCIPLINE AND PUNISHMENTS

Students committing any of the following offences shall be considered as an act of indiscipline:

1. **Use and display of mobile phones in academic blocks.**
2. Habitual unpunctuality.
3. Various forms of immoral and indecent acts.
4. Resorting to violence of any kind.
5. Disobedience to college authority, teachers and employees.
6. Smoking, chewing of tobacco and use of any intoxicants.

7. Damaging, defacing or devaluing any college property.
 8. Acts against public sanitation or any act calculated to cause public nuisance, disturbance of public, Tranquility, communal troubles or breach of public peace.
 9. Holding of any meeting in the college or hostel premises or college playground without permission or against the order of the Principal.
 10. Loitering in the College campus or in the College verandah.
 11. Use of unfair means in College examinations.

IDENTITY CARD AND RECORD BOOK

An identity card will be issued to every student on once the admission process of the College is over. The card shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph of the student duly endorsed by the Principal. The Identity Card is non-transferable. A student must keep the Identity Card with him/her and he/she must produce the same whenever asked for. *Students must renew his/ her Identity Card at the end of each academic year positively.* Every student will be issued a **Record Book** and the same has to be properly maintained by him/her. The Record Book will be necessary for various official purposes concerning the student. If lost, duplicate identity card, record book or receipt will be issued on proper communication to the competent authority.

EXAMINATIONS

The College Examinations are held according to the College Academic Calendar. A student must appear in all the examinations conducted by the College during an academic year. The College adheres to the rules and regulations of Gauhati University. As such, a student's performance is strictly monitored through continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Internal assessment is based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, projects, group discussions, fieldtrips, class attendance etc. At the end of each semester a final external examination is conducted as per the schedule fixed by the University. The final result of a student will be based on the total marks obtained in both internal and external examinations. Students must secure pass marks in both internal and external examinations separately.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Library

The College possesses a library with sizeable number of books, few journals including text books of various subjects required for various academic programs. Moreover, the library avails a good number of reference books, a number of newspapers in Assamese and English. Apart from the study materials, our College also provides free wi-fi internet facilities to the students and staff for academic purpose.

In our College, the students should observe the following rules and regulations in using the library:

1. Library membership is compulsory for all the students'.
2. Each student can borrow two books at a time.
3. Students should examine the book(s) issued to him/her before leaving the library. If any damage or mutilation is noticed, it should be reported to the Librarian immediately. Otherwise, he/she will be responsible for it.

4. Books provided by the Library to the students have to be returned within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of issue of the same.
5. Those who fail to return the borrowed books on time are subject to a fine of 50 paisa per day per book.
6. If the books found damaged in any form or lost during the said period of his/her possession, the student will have to pay the value of the book/books as directed by the College librarian.
7. If the library card is lost by any student it should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
8. Student should not make any noise or talk to each other while in the reading room.
9. The librarian may recall a book at any time in case of urgency.
10. The authority reserves the right of framing any additional rule(s) as may be necessary from time to time.

STUDENTS UNION

In our College, there is a Student Union which comprises of 12 members. The members of the Union are selected by holding election in which all the students of the college can vote. The Union of the College works for the overall development of every student. Every member of the Union emphasizes on the improvement of the personality of students of F. A. Ahmed College, Garoimari. Along with this, the union tries to create a good scope and environment in which the student can participate actively in the teaching learning process and can explore their own personality. The union body also assures that every student of our college will have the right to express their thoughts for all of our decisions. Moreover, The Students' Union, organizes some annual events like the Freshmen Social, Annual College Week etc. for which College authority provides all kinds of assistance.

Student Aid Fund: Students having poor economic background may receive special aid from this fund.

COLLEGE IQAC

The College has an "Internal Quality Assurance Cell" (IQAC). The IQAC is a quality concern Cell that monitors the overall quality related matters of the College. The IQAC was established in the year 2013 as per the direction of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

Under the umbrella of IQAC, the following Committees, Sub Committees, Cells are formed for the smooth functioning of the institutional quality mechanism.

Criteria wise Sub Committee

- 1.1. Curricular Aspects Sub Committee:** This sub-committee deals with curriculum design of the institution and information that how it offers diversity and flexibility to the learners.
- 1.2. Teaching, Learning & Evaluation Sub Committee:** This sub-committee deals with the efforts of the institution in providing appropriate teaching, learning, and experiences to the learners.
- 1.3. Research Consultancy & Extension Sub Committee:** This sub-committee deals with the activities of the institution with reference to research, consultancy and extension.
- 1.4. Infrastructure & Learning Resource Sub Committee:** This sub-committee deals with the adequacy and optional use of the facilities available in the institution.
- 1.5. Student Support & Progression Sub Committee:** This sub-committee deals with the effort of the institution to provide assistance for good students and to facilitate the progression, alumni profiles etc.

1.6. Governance & Leadership Sub Committee: This sub-committee deals with the policies and practices of the institution in the matter of planning, training, performance, appraisal and financial management.

1.7. Innovative Practices Sub Committee: This sub-committee deals with the innovative and unique practices of the institution that adds to its academic ambience.

2. **Planning Board:** The Planning Board assesses the overall requirement of the college and prepares plans and estimates as per fund available in the budget.

3. **Library Advisory Committee:** This committee deals with the proper management and the overall development of the College Library.

4. **Examination Board:** This board controls and conducts all internal examination of the college.

5. **Research Committee:** This Committee acts as a competent body to work for enhancement of the research culture among teachers and students.

6. **Grievance Redressal Cell:** The Grievance Redressal Cell deals with various grievances of the students as well as staff.

7. **Alumni Association:** The members of Alumni Association are actively associated with the overall development of the College.

8. **Extension Education Centre:** Education through Informal and Non-formal Programmes are the main area of action of this extension education centre.

To fulfill the objectives of this centre, there are some associations in our College:

8.1. Career Guidance & Counseling Center: This Centre provides information, guidance and imparts training, conducts seminars etc. to develop the professional career of the students.

8.2. Women Empowerment Cell: The Women Empowerment Cell deals with the activities towards community mobilization and women empowerment of the society.

8.3. National Service Scheme: The NSS unit of the college provides opportunities for students to render social service both inside and outside the College campus.

8.4. Sports Club: The sports club looks after the infrastructural facilities for games and sports. The club deals with various training and motivational activities among the students for the development of sport culture.

ANTI-RAGGING

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of sub section 1 of section 26 of the UGC Act, 1956 the UGC hereby makes the regulations, namely : “UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”, our College has decided to implement fully the anti-ragging regulations of the UGC.

(A) What Constitutes Ragging:

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following act

a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students.

b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.

c) Asking any student to do any act against his/ her will which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.

- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden on a fresher or any other student by students.
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of person.
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other students.
- i) Any acts that affect the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

(B) Administrative action in the event of ragging:

There is an Anti-Ragging Committee and an **anti-ragging squad** in the College. The Anti-Ragging Committee shall take an appropriate action as per the provision under “UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009” in regard to punishment student depending on the nature and gravity of the guilty established by the Anti-Ragging Squad.
