1. About the College:

The year 1984 of the last century was eventful and epoch in the history of Garoimari and its neighbouring areas because of establishing F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari. The people of the area extended spontaneous support for the establishment of a College. The then, some dedicated person led by late Omor Ali Sarkar having no formal education founded the College and named in memory of Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed (the former president of India). The employees of the College were to impart services without Salary till the provincialization of the College in 2013. The College was accorded affiliation by the University of Gauhati in 1996 & Govt. Concurrence in 1999. The College was provincialized on 01-01-2013. It was great achievement for the College getting 2(f) & 12(B) recognition of UGC Act 1956 in 2014.

Before establishment of the College, number of graduates could be counted on the top of finger in the area. Conceive of the College benefitted especially in female education among the minority people in the area. The medium of instruction is Assamese and English.

There is Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) study centre initiated in 2007 imparting education among the various section of the society. Especially, the working groups in different institutions are getting benefit from the KKHSOU. Presently, the center is disseminating higher education in three distinct department viz., Education. Political Science and Assamese.

6.1 Access:

- **6.1.1 Gender Equity:** F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari fosters equal opportunity to all irrespective to caste, creed, language and religion. Conducts various gender equity programmes. Gender Audit is initiated in the College.
- **6.1.2 Inclusion of Socio-Economic Deprived Groups (SEDGs):** Prime objective of F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari is to offer services to marginalized groups. Fee-Waiver policy is made convenient for the poor students. There is provision of availing Scholarship from various government sources.
- **6.1.3** Measures for increasing access including online and Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Education: F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari has been offering online courses at both Undergraduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) levels through Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) since 2007. In the current session, there are about 400 learners receiving education in distance mode under the Study Centre. Learners are counselled each Sunday. They are given Home Assignment, Projects etc. In some subjects, learners have to prepare Dissertation and submit it as per the guidelines of Affiliated University. The College facilitates study materials to the reader. The students have been guided to use various MOOCs and attend SWAYAM courses for updating their knowledge in their subjects.

6.2. Quality:

6.2.1 Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education: A 3 Membered NEP Task Force Committee is formed at F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari on 20/05/2022 for proper implementation of NEP, 2020. The College follows the policies and curricula prepared by Gauhati University. There is provision of MDC (Multidisciplinary), VAC (Value Added Course), AEC (Ability Enhancement

Course) and SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses) at the College prescribed by the affiliating University. In order to give proper guidance to the Staff as well as Students about the NEP-2020, there are organized seminar, workshop in the College. However, POs, PSOs and COs of NEP Syllabus (of 1st Semester) is displayed in the College website. The College has planning (IDP prepared) of proper implementation of NEP policies in future days. In coming days students will be encouraged to attend various workshop, seminar, conference, lecture etc. in different level. The exchange program among the teachers and students will be held in order to provide students opportunities to better communication, interaction and so on.

6.2.2 Flexibility of courses and student mobility-multiple entry and exit: ABC is a new concept for us. F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari has not yet registered with the ABC. The planning is on to introduce ABC system as soon as possible. The Members of NEP Task Force Committee are instructed to attend different seminar, workshop, talks in this respect to be comfortable with ABC. However, awareness has already been raised among the faculty members through activities like workshop, training program etc. The College has set up program to inform students about ABC, including how to register for an ABC Account and how to take advantage of multiple entry and exit of the College. These programs all assisted them in learning about the importance of selecting interdisciplinary, skill-based, and adaptable curricula to support equity, flexibility and high standards in undergraduate program.

6.2.3 Indian Knowledge System: F.A. Ahmed College conducts workshops, seminar, Add-on course on Indian Language. There is a course in Assamese honors on Indian Ancient Traditional Knowledge. We take our students to historically significant sites for inculcating ancient historical values. Students take part in cultural rallies showcasing ancient Indian tradition and culture. Units like Scout and Guide, Women Cell ensure active participation of students and teachers in activities like Yoga. In Political Science Department, one paper named 'Indian Political Thought' imparts knowledge of ancient Indian political tradition and ideologies to the students. In Philosophy under FYUGP/NEP, Ancient Indian Thought is a paper which gives the knowledge of Ancient Indian System of Veda, Epics, Manuscript and *Puranas*. Through the festivals, the students learn the Indian heritage and history i.e., Saraswati Puja is celebrated to worship *Matha Saraswati*, the Goddess of Learning.

6.2.4 Research, Innovation and Ranking: There is provision of undergoing research activities among the faculties as well as students. The teaching faculties and interested non-teaching employees are also encouraged in this respect. They are encouraged to go for MRP, participating FDP, organizing national seminar etc.

6.3 Future Preparedness:

- **6.3.1 Skill Enhancement Course:** Skilling students should be the priority of educational Institution. F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari takes humble initiatives in this regard. The College has Career Guidance and Placement Cell, NSS Unit, Scout & Guide Cell to engage the students in different skilling activities.
- **6.3.2 Enhancing** Employability through internship/apprenticeship: Career Guidance and Placement Cell of F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari takes initiative for skilling students. F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari has signed MoU with ANUDEP Foundation, ICT Academy, AMTRON etc. for organizing soft skill as well as capacity building programme for both teachers and students.

There has provision of undergoing some Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) under CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) in the College in which any student can take part. In undergoing the SEC, there is to go for field visit/ survey. However, Add-on courses have been introduced by various Departments which are basically related with skill development. Through numerous career counselling sessions, the College has also taken steps to help students to build professional abilities.

- **6.3.3 Accreditation for quality education:** F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari is seriously working for NAAC visit. It will be accomplished as soon as possible.
- **6.3.4 Transforming education through integration of technology:** F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari is poor in ICT. SOUL 3.0 is installed in Library for automation. However, thre is small Computer Lab at the College which is going to upgraded soon for enhancing technological knowledge among the students.
- **6.3.5 Governance:** Governance is looked after by the G.B. of the College which is constituted by the Directorate of Higher Education. Where principal i/c acts as the member

secretary of the Committee. E-governance is gradually implemented at F.A. Ahmed College, Garoimari. There are some important aspects already introduced and implemented E-Governance as Admission, Examination and Finance (partly). In Administration, yet to be introduced.

10. Strategic Development Plan

10.1 Office Complex

Office of the College including Principal's room, account branch, clerical room are the basic part of the College. All the people are to contact with the office for major works, it will be the humble effort of the College to make the offices integral so as to easy visit for students and related people. The College has a one storied RCC Building where all the offices, library along with some classrooms are merged together, it will be approach of the College to construct a separate administrative building solely for Principal, Non-teaching Staff in the top floor and the Library of the College in the ground floor just to the north of existing RCC Building.

10.2 Campus Barricade and Beautification

There are about 25 bighas (15.49 acre) of land documented in the name of College. A portion of College Boundary Wall remains uncompleted that needs to be completed at earliest. All the paths inside the College premises are *Katcha*. Effort is on for the construction of the road. The College authority is trying to make the College premises beautiful with plantation and gardening but has been the challenging paucity of fund. Effort shall be made to preserve and enhance the vegetation to make the College campus green.

10.3 Development of Games & Sports

The College has a playground used for different games & sports. At Present, the playground lies from east to west. There is a founded AT (Assam Type) Building located to the south side of the playground. But, there are some low lying open space to the south of the building which is needed to plan for earth filling. AT Building is planned to demolish and construct new buildings to southern most of the campus. The Playground will then be made north to south and it will be big play ground for football, Volley Ball, Tennis etc.

The College has a pond (Fishery) leased out for producing fish. It can be turned into more potential projects like Swimming Pool and manual boating facilities for amusement. However, the College has planning for establishing Indoor Stadium, Gymnasium within the College campus.

10.4 Accommodation and Support Facilities:

10.4.1 Hostel & Guest House

The construction of Women's' Hostel is under process with the grant of UGC which will be opened for the girls as soon as construction is over. However, application is submitted to the Deputy Commissioner, Kamrup (Assam) asking for land for the construction of Boys Hostel and Guest House in a separate campus because Girls Hostel is located inside the College Campus.

10.4.2 Defecation Facilities

Although, the College is having toilets for both Girls and Boys are not sufficient. More toilets as per the requirement of students and staff of the College is needed and planned to establish.

10.4.3 Yoga Centre

The College has an open Platform named "Bhupen Hazarika Open Manch" which is generally used to for open gathering. The Manch is also used for Yoga purposes. But, a separate complex is needed for Yoga purposes and planned to establish it conveniently.

10.4.4 Construction of Canteen:

There is a two storied Multi-Purpose Community Hall in the College premises under the guidance and management of Kamrup Zila Parishad. The said building is planned to take in lease from the said authority used as College Auditorium and the Food Court within the Auditorium can be used as College Canteen. A College own Canteen is needed and planned to go for establishing it and renovation the existing one.

10.4.5 Renovation of Classrooms and Laboratories

Although, the College has number of classrooms and meeting the needs of the classes, more classrooms are necessary and very essential to renovate for new look. As fund permits, some more number of classrooms will be established.

10.4.6 Construction of Seminar Hall/Conference Hall/Digital Classroom/Smart Classrooms along with Development of ICT

The College needs digitized Seminar Hall/Conference Hall. Also needs digitised classroom/Smart Classroom etc. The College administration has planning to construct necessary Seminar Hall/Conference Hall, Digital Classroom etc. The College has to construct a conference cum seminar hall in its campus of own. A new conference cum seminar hall will be constructed in the campus to accommodate the needs of the College. Though the College has sufficient physical space to accommodate all academic programmes and facilities, it is underprovided in terms of the ICT. The College is lacking a smart classrooms. Smart classroom is need of hour and planned to construct in the College when fund permits.

10.4.7 Effective Waste Management

Waste management in F.A. Ahmed College is not scientific. Whatever waste is generated is managed in a haphazard way. There are dustbin which are used to deposit the waste materials created within the College campus and finally burnt. The dustbin are to be increased in number as per requirement. Some bigger size permanent dustbin are to be constructed. However, the e-wastages are to be recycled in a proper ways and thus planned to either exhaust scientifically or recycle.

10.4.8 Medicinal Plantation

The College campus is enriched with land resources that can be used for various plantation programme especially medicinal plants. Of course, the College is not having the completed boundary wall that creates a holistic problem to undergo the plantation schemes. The cows, goat and other grazing animals havoes the plants. Therefore, it is planned to undergo the construction of boundary wall and go for general vegetation as well as medicinal plantation.

10.4.9 Heritage Museum

The College plans to establish a Museum. Some of the cultural and livelihood means of the people of Goroimari area are preserved in a small room which is not sufficient. In future, a Heritage Museum will be established within the College premises.

Apart from these aforesaid plans, the College has the plan to include all the stakeholders of the institutions in the development of the College and the region. The institution has the plan to ensure inclusive growth and knowledge output for human development and to create awareness on some radical aspects like environment and sustainable development, human rights, value system, women empowerment, culture, heritage, scientific temper etc.
