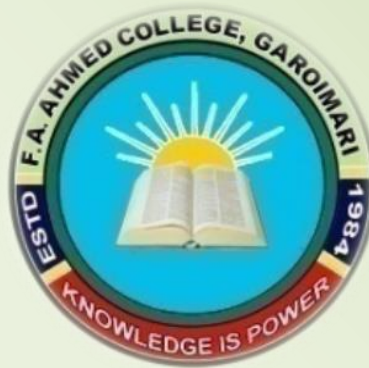

The year 1984 of the last century was eventful and epochal in the history of Garoimari and its neighboring areas. At that time, a handful of people got knowledge literacy; the logic of higher education, by and large, disappeared in the area. It was almost beyond the dream of producing highly educated people from a manpower-producing industry established in Garoimari. A few among them realized the need for higher education. Among them, we must include the following personalities: Omor Ali Sarkar (the founder-president of the Managing Committee), Abdul Hakim (the Founder-Secretary), and many others who endeavored to establish the college. Abdul Qayyum Al Aman took on the pioneering role as Honorary Principal of the College when regular classes began. He played an active, pioneering role in shaping the foundation of the College. Besides, the contributions of all the MLAs of Chhaygaon Constituency since 1980 till date are no less memorable for their all kind of assistance. The minority Muslims people mostly dominate Garoimari, dependent basically on the agrarian economy. The people of the area spontaneously supported establishing a college. The mission of the college was to spread the rays of higher education, breaking the barrier of darkness among rural people.

In 1984, on an auspicious day, the dream became a reality with the establishment of the higher educational institution, F.A. Ahmed College. The College is named in memory of Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed, an Assamese son who served as the President of India from 1974 to 1977. It is the only higher educational institution that has been imparting education in the Degree Classes (Arts) since its inception.

At the initial stage, Abdur Rahman Khan served as the college's honorary principal. Mr. Habibur Rahman served as the college's Principal until his retirement on 31st December 2014. The college was provincialized by the State Government of Assam w.e.f. 01/01/2013, but the Post of the principal was not provincialized. It will always remain incomparable to him who offers about 24 years of prolonged service. After his departure, Abdul Awal Sahab has taken charge of the principal and is continuing. The college has a vast, sprawling campus covering 3.34 hectares (25 bighas) of land, and its serene atmosphere attracts one and all. The co-educational Arts Degree College had a humble beginning with 161 students and 10 faculty members at its establishment. At present, about 902 students have been enrolled and facilitated for higher education. The teaching component comprises 30 faculties and various supporting services, including an 'Internal Quality Assurance Cell' (IQAC). The student feedback system has been introduced to address deficiencies in the course and enhance teaching quality. The college has traversed a long distance since its inception. It has produced a large number of brilliant students who have been recruited in Govt. and semi-Govt. Institutions and entered a University, and many of them are well placed in both their social and personal lives.

COMMON COURSES

- Multi-Disciplinary Courses: These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects- (i) Natural and Physical Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is Class XII.

- Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Communication.
- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These are various skill courses with a total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester III.
- Value-Based Courses (VAC): The VAC courses will come from four subgroups- (i) Disaster Management, (ii) United Nations and Human Rights (iii) Understanding India, (iv) Environmental Science, (v) Digital and Technological Solutions, (vi) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. Altogether they will have a credit allocation of 6.
- Internship: All students of B.A 4th Semester are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4.

As shown in the figures, the base credit score for a 3-Year course is 120 and a student needs to have at least 50% of 120 i.e. 60 credits in a subject to qualify for a major in that subject. In the same way a minor course will have 12 credits and a student can have two minors with a total of 24 credits. Apart from the Major subject, if a student can obtain 48 credits in a particular subject, the student will get a double major.

POST GRADUATE COURSES UNDER KKHSOU:

Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University Study Centre of F. A. Ahmed College, Garoimari was founded in the year 2007. Initially it was started with Bachelor Preparatory Programme (Now discontinued by university) and Bachelor Degree programme. Gradually the Centre started offering Master programmes also. As per guide line of the university the study Centre organizes counseling sessions for the learners on Sundays, Self-Learning Materials (SLM) are supplied by the university and are distributed by the study Centre.

At present, the study Centre is offering the following Courses

B. A. Honors & Regular Courses in all subjects (Arts Stream).

M.A. Courses in Assamese, Economics, Education, Hindi, Mathematics and Political Science. .

At present, the study center has been imparting education about 350 learners.

General Admission Rules:

Eligibility:

Degree Course: A candidate must pass the Assam State School Education Board ASSEB or equivalent (10+2 Standard) examination recognized by Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

Admission will be based on merit and a personal interview. The prospectus and application form can also be downloaded from the college website www.faac.org.in. Reservations for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates, physically handicapped candidates, and candidates with proficiency in extracurricular activities will be made as per the government. Rules and regulations. Complete the application form in all respects and submit it online on or before the last date of submission. Necessary documents must be uploaded online. The college will not entertain application for admission received after the last date of submission.

Admission Procedure

- i. Application for Admission to the college should be made in the online application forms available on the College website
- ii. Admission is strictly on merit and is governed by the College's admission rules. The Admission Committee's decision in this regard is final.
- iii. Applicants will have to appear in person at the time of admission with original copies of the Pass Certificate, Mark Sheet, Age Certificate, Character Certificate (from the Heads of the institution last attended), Caste Certificate (where necessary), and any other document notified from time to time.
- iv. No applications will be accepted after the submission deadline.
- v. Reservation of seats will be entertained as per the Government rules.
- vi. Extra-Curricular (EC) quota will be maintained as per the Govt. norms in all classes

Fee Structure: The fee structure for different courses will be in accordance with the guidelines of the Government of Assam. These structures will be notified on the college notice board and the college website.

Candidate Seeking Admission shall have to produce the following Documents in Original at the time of Admission

- One set of photocopies of mark sheets duly attested, of qualifying/last attested examination (ASSEB/CBSE)
- A certificate from the Head of the institution last attended must be enclosed with the application form.
- Four recent passport-size photographs should be pasted on the application form, and two additional photographs should be enclosed.
- H.S.L.C. Admit Card (attested copy) must be enclosed with the application form.
- ST/SC/OBC candidates and those seeking admission under the co-curricular quota must enclose relevant certificates.
- An applicant with a gap period should produce a gap certificate.
- The application form must be completed in all respects.
- Applicants are directed to bring all original certificates and testimonials for verification at the time of form submission and the interview.

College Discipline-General Regulations

1. Students must come to the College invariably in the prescribed uniform. They must bring an Identity Card and a Student's Handbook and produce them when asked for. This rule is considered the minimum requirement for maintaining the College's discipline.
2. All the students should read the Notice Board of the College regularly and note their own important instructions in the Student's Handbook.
3. Students should be decent, courteous, and polite at all times, whether they are in class or on the college premises.
4. Students should respect the beauty and cleanliness of the College and take utmost care to promote the same.
5. Scribbling on books, desks and walls is strictly prohibited and liable to fines.
6. Spitting, writing and sticking anything on the College walls/rooms are strictly prohibited.
7. Students should park their vehicles in the area allotted for the purpose,
8. Disobedience and misbehavior towards staff members or repeated breaking of college rules or behavior objectionable to the good tone of the school, even outside the college premises will deserve severe punishment or even dismissal if warnings are ignored.
9. Students are prohibited from going out of the college premises during college hours without the prior permission of the Principal. They are advised to utilize their leisure time in the College library/common room/canteen. They will not be allowed to loiter or sit in the veranda.
10. Ragging in any form, inside or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited by law. Any student found indulging in ragging will be expelled from the College.
11. The College is a No Smoking/ No Tobacco/ No Drugs/ No Alcohol Zone. Students found violating these rules will be dealt with as per rules of the college.
12. Students should not damage the property of the institution. Cost of any damage will be recovered from the students as compensation.
13. Students will not be included in any anti-social activities or activities causing hindrance to the academic and administrative functioning of the College. Those found indulging in such activities will face disciplinary action to the extent of expulsion from the college.
14. During the teaching hours all areas around the classrooms will be observed as Silent zones. The authority will deal with students who create any disturbance, as it deem right. Keep silence when the classes are on.

15. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited during class and examination hours. Any violation is subject to severe disciplinary action.

16. No student shall intentionally or recklessly disrupt or impede or attempt to disrupt or impede the activities and functions of the college, or any part thereof.

17. Irregular attendance, constant negligence of assignments will be severely dealt with. A minimum attendance of 75% is required to appear in the university examinations. In case of absence due to unavoidable circumstances, prior permission from the appropriate authority must be obtained, and the handbook must be endorsed. In case of sickness, students will have to produce a Medical Certificate with a guardian's application.

18. Class tests, Unit tests, Assignments, and Terminal/Sessional examinations are obligatory for all students. No one should absent himself/herself for an examination/test. If a student is absent for a test or examination, a retest or reexamination will not be given, except on medical/genuine grounds.

19. No candidate shall make use of any unfair means in any examination.

20. Students' participation and active co-operation in all observation days and other co-curricular activities is must.

Students' responsibilities:

1. Appreciate the institutional goals and objectives and contribute to their realization by participating in relevant institutional activities
2. Have a clear knowledge of the programs, admission policies, rules, and regulations of the institution.
3. Understand the teaching and learning strategies and evaluation systems of the institution.
4. Follow the time schedules, rules, and regulations of the institution.
5. Undertake regular and intense study of learning materials.

Organization and Management:

Administration: The Governing Body is the apex body duly formed by D.H.E. Assam. The Principal, the Head of the institution, is the secretary of the G.B.

Committees/Cells/Clubs: For the smooth functioning of the administrative as well as academic activities of the College, there are a number of committees/cells/clubs:

NSS: There is one NSS unit in the college. The NSS unit of the college involves students in various social service programs, both inside and outside the college, under the guidance of the program officer.

The Bharat Scouts & Guides: The Bharat Scouts & Guides (BSG) is the National Scouting and Guiding Association of India. The male members are called Rovers, and the female members are called Rangers. The College has both the Ranger Team and the Rover Crew.

Alumni Association: An Institution of higher learning needs, for its organic growth, active co-operation and support from the Alumni, who weave a golden thread around it. The alumni contributed significantly to the college's development. A number of such Alumni are holding prominent positions in society.

Reservation of Seats: For the admission in B.A. 1st Semester (Major/ Minor), the reservation policy of the State Govt. Assam is followed.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC): Quality is vital in every area, particularly in higher education, and the growing worldwide awareness of enhancing quality in higher education underscores this. Keeping in mind the new challenges of higher education, the college has constituted an “INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL” to look into the qualitative aspects of the College. It is a high-level committee that sets down quality parameters and ensures their implementation

Reservation Rules:

1. There is a provision for reservation of seats, as per Government of Assam rules for the candidates belonging to the State of Assam. In this respect, caste certificate issued by the competent authority under Government of Assam only shall be valid.
2. A maximum 5% of the total seats may be earmarked for students having outstanding performance in Extra-Curricular Activities (Sports/Cultural/NCC/ Scouts & Guides etc.).
3. There is a provision of reservation of 3% of the total seats for 'Differently Abled' candidates under PWD category.

College Rules and Regulations:

1. Use of Mobile Phones by students in the College premises is restricted. Violation of this rule will invite severe disciplinary action.
2. The College lays great emphasis on students' discipline and character building. Students are always expected to maintain a high standard of discipline.

3. Every student must abide by the College and the hostel rules and regulations. A declaration to that effect will have to be signed by a student at the time of admission.
4. A student found guilty of misconduct or violating college rules shall be subject to disciplinary action. Disciplinary action includes expulsion from college, suspension for a period, barring from appearing in an examination, compulsory transfer, etc.
5. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the college and hostel campus. Students found indulging in ragging shall be dealt with severely in accordance with the directives of the Supreme Court of India.
6. Smoking, chewing of tobacco, and use of any intoxicants on the college and hostel campus is strictly prohibited.
7. Loitering on the College campus or verandah is prohibited. A student may be reprimanded if found doing so.
8. Cleanliness is a collective responsibility of each and every member of the College. Spitting on walls is strictly prohibited. Writing slogans or sticking bills on the walls is also strictly prohibited.
9. Students should regularly check the College Notice Board for all information.
10. All powers of maintenance of discipline and observance of college rules and regulations rest with the Principal of the College, and his/her decision shall be final in all such matters.

College Uniform:

F. A. Ahmed College has a uniform dress code for both boys and girls.

Boys : Grey shirt and Black Trouser

Girls : Grey Kurta, Black Trouser & Dupatta

A College uniform is compulsory for all students, and no other dress will be allowed within the College premises.

Discipline and Punishments:

Students committing any of the following offenses shall be considered as an act of indiscipline:

1. Use and display of mobile phones in academic blocks.
2. Habitual unpunctuality.
3. Various forms of immoral and indecent acts.
4. Resorting to violence of any kind.
5. Disobedience to college authority, teachers and employees.
6. Smoking, chewing of tobacco and use of any intoxicants.
7. Damaging, defacing or devaluing any college property.
8. Acts against public sanitation or any act calculated to cause public nuisance, disturbance of public, Tranquility, communal troubles or breach of public peace.
9. Holding of any meeting in the college or hostel premises or college playground without permission or against the order of the Principal.
10. Loitering in the College campus or in the College verandah.
11. Use of unfair means in College examinations.

IDENTITY CARD AND RECORD BOOK

An identity card will be issued to every student once the College's admission process is complete. The card shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport-size photograph of the student, duly endorsed by the Principal. The Identity Card is non-transferable. A student must keep the Identity Card with him/her and produce it whenever asked for. Students must renew their Identity Cards at the end of each academic year. Every student will be issued a Record Book, which must be properly maintained by him/her. The Record Book will be required for various official purposes related to the student. If lost, a duplicate identity card, record book, or receipt will be issued on proper communication to the competent authority.

EXAMINATIONS

The College Examinations are held in accordance with the College Academic Calendar. A student must appear in all the examinations conducted by the College during an academic year. The College adheres to the rules and regulations of Gauhati University. As such, a student's performance is strictly monitored through continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Internal assessment is based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, projects, group discussions, fieldtrips, class attendance, etc. At the end of each semester, a final external examination is conducted as per the schedule fixed by the University. A student's final result will be based on the total marks obtained in both internal and external examinations. Students must secure pass marks in both internal and external examinations separately.

Student Support Services

Library

The College possesses a library with a sizeable number of books, a few journals, including textbooks of various subjects required for various academic programs. Moreover, the library has a good number of reference books and newspapers in Assamese and English. In addition to the study materials, our College also provides free Wi-Fi to students and staff for academic purposes.

In the College, the students should observe the following rules and regulations in using the library:

1. Library membership is compulsory for all students.
2. Each student can borrow two books at a time.
3. Students should examine the book(s) issued to him/her before leaving the library. If any damage or mutilation is noticed, it should be reported to the Librarian immediately. Otherwise, he/she will be responsible for it.
4. Books provided by the library to students must be returned within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of issue.
5. Those who fail to return the borrowed books on time are subject to a fine of 50 paisa per day per book.
6. If the books are found damaged in any form or lost during the said period of his/her possession, the student will have to pay the value of the book/books as directed by the College librarian.
7. If a student loses their library card, it should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
8. Students should not make any noise or talk to each other while in the reading room.
9. The librarian may recall a book at any time in the event of an emergency.
10. The authority reserves the right to frame any additional rule(s) as may be necessary from time to time.

Students' Union

At the College, the Student Union comprises 12 members. The members of the Union are selected through an election in which all college students vote. The Union of the College works for the overall development of every student. Every member of the Union emphasizes the improvement of the personality of students of F. A. Ahmed College, Garoimari. Along with this, the union aims to create a conducive environment and scope for students to actively participate in the teaching-learning process and explore their own personalities. The union body also assures that every student of our College will have the right to express their thoughts on all of our decisions. Moreover, the Students' Union organizes annual events such as the Freshmen Social, Annual College Week, Saraswati Puja, and Muharram, for which the college authority provides all necessary assistance.

Student Aid Fund: Students with limited financial means may receive special aid from this fund.

College IQAC

The College has an "Internal Quality Assurance Cell" (IQAC). The IQAC is a quality concern Cell that monitors the overall quality-related matters of the College. The IQAC was established in 2013 at the direction of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

Under the umbrella of IQAC, the following Committees, Sub-Committees, and Cells have been formed to ensure the smooth functioning of the institutional quality mechanism.

1. Criteria:

- 1.1. Curricular Aspects: This criteria oversees the institution's curriculum design and provides information on how it offers diversity and flexibility to learners.

- 1.2. Teaching-Learning and Evaluation: This criteria oversees the institution's efforts to provide appropriate teaching, learning, and experiences for learners.
- 1.3. Research, Innovations, and Extension: This criteria oversees the institution's activities in research, consultancy, and extension.
- 1.4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources: This criteria addresses the adequacy and optional use of the facilities available at the institution.
- 1.5. Student Support and Progression: This criteria deals with the institution's efforts to provide assistance to good students and to facilitate progression, alumni profiles, etc.
- 1.6. Governance, Leadership and Management: This criteria oversees the institution's policies and practices in planning, training, performance, appraisal, and financial management.
- 1.7. Institutional Values and Best Practices: The criteria deals with the innovative and unique practices of the Institution that adds to its academic ambience. Institutional Distinctiveness of the College is "Persuasion of Females towards Higher Education," and Best Practices are "Work for Marginalized Children in Externalizing their Uniqueness" and "Institutional Responsibility towards Society."
2. **Planning Board:** The Planning Board assesses the overall requirement of the college and prepares plans and estimates as per fund available in the budget.
3. **Library Advisory Committee:** This committee oversees the proper management and overall development of the College Library.
4. **Examination Board:** This board controls and conducts all internal examination of the college.
5. **Research Committee:** This Committee acts as a competent body to work for enhancement of the research culture among teachers and students.
6. **Grievance Redressal Cell:** The Grievance Redressal Cell addresses various grievances of students and staff.
7. **Alumni Association:** The members of Alumni Association are actively associated with the overall development of the College.
8. **Extension Education Centre:** Education through Informal and Non-formal Programmes are the main area of action of this extension education Centre.

To fulfill the objectives of this centre, there are some associations in our college:

- 8.1. **Career Guidance & Counseling Center:** This Centre provides information, guidance and imparts training, conducts seminars etc. to develop the professional career of the students.
- 8.2. **Women Empowerment Cell:** The Women Empowerment Cell deals with the activities towards community mobilization and women empowerment of the society.
- 8.3. **National Service Scheme:** The NSS unit of the college provides opportunities for students to render social service both inside and outside the College campus.
- 8.4. **Sports Club:** The sports club looks after the infrastructural facilities for games and sports. The club deals with various training and motivational activities among the students for the development of sport culture.

Anti-Ragging

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of sub-section 1 of section 26 of the UGC Act, 1956, the UGC hereby makes the regulations, namely: "UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". The College has decided to implement the UGC anti-ragging regulations.

What Constitutes Ragging:

Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts

- (a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students.
- (b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- (c) Asking any student to do any act against his/ her will which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.

(d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.

(e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.

(f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden on a fresher or any other student by students.

(g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of person.

(h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, or public insults, which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture of fresher or any other students.

(i) Any acts that affect the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student, with or without intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or show off power, authority, or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

A. Administrative action in the event of ragging:

There is an Anti-Ragging Committee and an anti-ragging squad in the College. The Anti-Ragging Committee shall take an appropriate action as per the provision under “UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009” in regard to punishing students depending on the nature and gravity of the offense established by the Anti-Ragging Squad.
